ORDINANCE NO. 1527

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A PARK COMMISSION FOR THE VILLAGE OF GLANDORF, OHIO

Whereas, the Council of the Village of GLANDORF, Ohio, desires to establish a dedicated citizen commission to advise on the management, development and use of Village parks; and

Whereas, the Council of the Village of GLANDORF, Ohio, finds that the public health, safety and general welfare are advanced by providing well-maintained public parks and recreational facilities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GLANDORF, OHIO, BY AT LEAST TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section I. There is hereby created and established a commission to be known as the Park Commission.

Section II. The Park Commission shall consist of five (5) voting members who reside within the Ottawa-Glandorf school district. All members shall be appointed by the Mayor of the Village of Glandorf with a President and Vice-President elected for terms as set by the Commission.

Section III. The members of the Park Commission shall serve a term of five (5) years. Initial appointments shall be staggered (e.g. two members for three (3) years, two members for four (4) years and one member for five (5) years). Any vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment until the term of the vacant member ends. Members shall serve without compensation.

Section IV. The members of the Park Commission shall hold regular meetings quarterly, unless deemed otherwise needed, with meeting minutes kept. A majority of the voting members shall constitute a quorum.

Section V. The Park Commission shall act solely in an advisory capacity to Council on the management, development and use of Village parks. All reports/proposals shall be made to and approved by The Village of Glandorf Council. The Commission shall also formulate plans for the Village park system focusing not only on the immediate needs but also the future needs of the village.

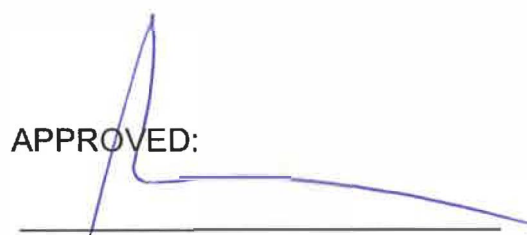
Section VI. In the event any portion of this Ordinance shall be found by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability thereof, shall not affect the remaining provisions of the Ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
